In **Applied Conservation Field Work PRST-647**, students will learn via field work historically appropriate treatments for 19th Century above-ground tombs. The Taylor Tomb in the Secret Garden of Lafayette Cemetery No. 1 will serve as one case study. Students will work under the tutelage of master craftsmen to learn about lime-based building technology in plaster, mortar, limewash and masonry applications.

Field Studies in Historic Preservation PRST-646 will be a seminar taught by professors in the TSA Preservation Studies Program. Topics include architectural history, preservation technology, landscape architecture, funerary iconography and history of New Orleans Cemeteries. Students will learn how to navigate through local archives to collect research for individual papers and group projects.
